BUBARAN ROBERT by Lou Harrison
Bubaran is a traditional musical form, a short, lively
piece suitable for ending or beginning a program.
This bubaran is written by an American composer, following
traditional form.

ASMARANDANA - traditional Javanese

This piece shows both the strong style of gamelan playing and the gentle, slow tempo inwhich elaborating instruments predominate, adding filigree to the slow, quiet melody. Singing is also included. Dance in refined female style.

KODOK GNOREK - traditonal Javanese
The "croaking frog" is an ancient, ceremonial piece often
performed on a special set of instruments of the same name.
It emphasizes clunking, frog-like sounds.

WAYANG KULIT, shadow puppet play - traditional Javanese
A short excerpt of what would be an all-night drama performed
by torch light. Accompanying music uses the pieces Monggang,
Srepagan, Sampak and Gangsaran.

KETCHAK - modern Balinese
An example of a "new" art form which has evolved based on an episode from the ancient Ramayana epic. The chanters impersonate monkeys, vocalizing in the patterns of Balinese instrumental music.

GINEMAN - Balinese

A short piece from the repertoire of the angklung gamelan, which has only four notes, illustrating the dynamic changes and interlocking parts of Balinese music.

EINE KLEINE GAMELAN MUSIC by Daniel Goode
This contemporary composition by one of Son of Lion's composers
illustrates the use of gamelan instruments in experimental context.
Accompanying dance shows a variety of Indonesian clown masks
and movement styles.
