In Slendro in Vitro

David Behrman

a work in progress exploring a relationship between the slendro timbre world of Gamelan Son of Lion and a miniature computer-controlled music system, whose electronic sounds are tuned to the gamelan and are activated by the playing of two electric mbiras. Six sections will be performed today.

Four Voice Canon #7

Larry Polansky

World premier for Gamelan Son of Lion. The piece is in the form of a mensuration canon with the four voices playing the same part in different mathematical proportions to eachother. Pitch permutations were determined by computer process.

Bedhaya Sadra/ Bedhaya Guthrie

Larry Polansky and I Wayan Sadra

For voices, kemanak and gamelan. Guthrie's melody to "The Ranger's Command" is transformed step by step, by computer process, into a melody by Indonesian composer Sadra, and vice versa

Pangkur N.Z.

Jody Diamond

Based on a Javanese poetic meter *macapat* and its associated melody, Pangkur N.Z. is concerned with the meeting of vocal and instrumental music, the meaning of poetic texts and how a simple melody used for singing unaccompanied poetry can be strong enough to support the entire gamelan and various linguistic transformations as well. English translations of the *macapat* are by Suranto Atmosaputro and Martin Hatch Also inserted is a verse from "Ambulando" by New Zealand poet Charles Brasch.
