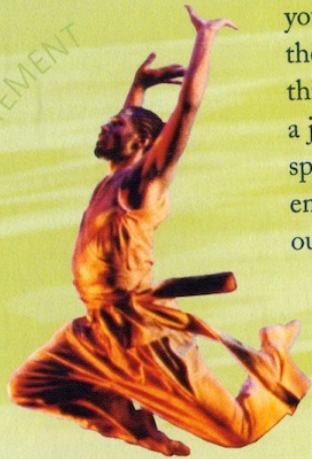

Gamelan Son of Lion - Barbara Benary, David Demnitz, Bill Jacobs, Jody Kruskal, Laura Liben, David Simmons

Gamelan Son of Lion has been performing and presenting new music in the New York area since 1976. The group specializes in contemporary pieces written for instruments, built by Artistic Director Barbara Benary, of the Javanese gamelan percussion orchestra. It has premiered over 100 compositions and toured in Indonesia, Canada, and New Zealand.

Felicia Norton and Leroy Jenkins

Dancer Felicia Norton and Guggenheim Fellow violinist/composer Leroy Jenkins have been performing together since 1988. Their collaboration, both improvisational and commissioned, yields an innovative fusion of contemporary dance and jazz violin. Both have performed all over the world as solo artists and throughout the states together.

Laraaji

Improvisational zither player Laraaji has been involved in music since his New Jersey youth. He discovered the zither in the 1970s and made the instrument his own. Also a comedian, Laraaji's unique sound, infectious laughter, and myriad recordings have delighted audiences around the globe for years.

Brenda Hutchinson

Composer/Sound Artist Brenda Hutchinson will perform her original composition, "The Unfortunate Soprano" on the Long Tube instrument. Using a combination of computer sampling, playback, and the modulations of the tube itself, Hutchinson creates a distinctive performance of "soundscapes." Her multi-media work in performance, composition, and sound design has been presented internationally and in the states.

Yoshiko Chuma and Robert Black

Dancer Yoshiko Chuma and bassist Robert Black are performing "Duo or Trio," a concept by Chuma. Combining their solo talents for over a decade, the avant garde performers put their own spin on modern dance and music. Chuma is also the founder of The School of Hard Knocks, a performing arts company, and Black performs and records globally, alone and with other artists.

Martita Goshen

Choreographer/dancer/teacher Martita Goshen has fascinated audiences in New York City for years. She founded the dance company, Earthworks, in 1981, and was honored by the acceptance of her movie, *Journey to Three Ancient Sites*, by the Lincoln Center Film Festival in 2003. Goshen is also a master teacher with Arts Connection.

Claire Porter

Choreographer/dancer Claire Porter is currently touring "Namely, Muscles," an inventive piece that enacts all the body's muscles in poetry. She has performed her work, "Portables," all over Europe, Asia, and New York City. This year, Porter received a Mid-Atlantic Arts Foundation Award for "From Jobs to Geraniums."
