## THE RAMAYANA

The Ramayana is a popular Asian epic which has inspired the arts in many media. Today's production presents the story in the classical dance style of Western Java. It is a production of the Bali-Java Dance Theatre of New York City with the cooperation of the East-West Fusion Theatre of Sharon, Conn. Choreography is by Deena Burton. The music score is arranged by Barbara Benary, using both traditional Javanese and original compositions.
