The Hermit Thrush is a master songster found in the remote woods of North America. Since the 1970's I have transcribed its music for various instruments from my field recordings, listening back at half-speed, so the complex, varied melodies are more discernible. The Wood Thrush has different, but similar phrases, and can even be heard occasionally from a backyard. I have associated this "natural" music with human music, just as rich, made and played often in outdoor settings, perhaps surrounded by birds and other worldly sounds. We are fortunate to have with us a master musician from Bulgaria who has studied and played the music from the Rhodope mountains of southern Bulgaria (ancient Thrace) where the *gaida* [bagpipe] is the pre-eminent instrument. —DG

Commissioned by the Minnesota quartet, Zeitgeist, and premiered in St. Paul in May, 1998, *Aural Shoehorning* melds the rich, non-western tunings of the metalophones of the Indonesian gamelan with the nearest equivalent tones in Western tuning, resulting in a lush, heterophonic texture. The title refers to this process of thrusting one tuning into the midst of the other.
