On December 11th, 8pm at The Nyack Center, Broadway & Depew Streets, Nyack NY:

The new music ensemble Gamelan Son of Lion will present a program together with the Jody Oberfelder Dance Projects of new music and dance with Javanese gamelan instruments.

Gamelan Son of Lion is a ten member ensemble performing on the percussion instruments known collectively as gamelan. This combination of Javanese tuned gongs, drums, and American-made metallophones (xylophones) is supplimented at time by flutes, voices, instruments from around the world and even struck hubcaps and other found-sound percussion. The ensemble has been presenting programs in Rockland county as well as its home base in downtown Manhattan since 1976.

The December 11th program will feature a number of newly composed works. Daniel Goode's **Re:Sound** is a collaborative work with choreographer Jody Oberfelder which translates the physical gestures of semaphores, the language of signal flags, into musical patterns playable both on keyboards and on tuned hubcaps. The five dancers loop, plunge, spring and weave in a dynamic interplay of resonance and emotion, with each musical sound triggering a particular phrase of movement.

Also featured on the program is composer David Simons' piece **Cool It Wayang**, which expands on melodies from the small Balinese ensemble *gender wayang* which traditionally accompanies Bali's shadow puppet theatre. Selections will also be heard from Barbara Benary's **Aural Shoehorning**, a study in combining and contrasting the different tuning systems of the gamelan (with it's two non-harmonic scales of *slendro* and *pelog*) with diatonic western instruments.
