First conceived in 1990 this action packed story ballet has become BALAM's signature work. Inspired by the Hindu epic, *Ramayana* depicts a timeless struggle between good and evil enacted by four mythic characters.

Synopsis — Rama and Sita, unjustly banished from their kingdom, enter the forest where they dance, and lovingly build a house of branches. Sita, spotted by the evil demon Rahwana, is lured away and abducted by his accomplice the beautiful Golden Deer. Rahwana tries to break Sita's spirit and possess her. Sita, desperate, prays as Rama finds her clue on the forest floor. Rama meditates and invokes Bayu, the god of inspiration, who shows Rama where Sita is imprisoned. Rama rushes to rescue Sita, and must battle the mighty Rahwana. Their struggle is tremendous, and with the last of his strength and blessed by the gods, Rama crushes Rahwana with an arrow shot from his magic bow.

About Us

BALAM Dance Theatre (BALAM) is a unique chamber sized dance ensemble that fuses Balinese and contemporary dance styles. This aesthetic alchemy represents a convergence of esoteric and modern sensibilities and presents a vision of Contemporary-World dance.

Founded by Islene Pinder, a CUNY professor of dance and choreographer, and later joined in 1990 by choreographer/dance-artist, Carlos Fittante, BALAM's fusion repertoire is derived from the skills of its artists. BALAM's dancers embody an eclectic cross-section of New York's diverse dance community including Ballet, Baroque, Lester Horton, Martha Graham, Noh and Karate movement techniques synthesized with Balinese dance.

Known for its "taksu," or mesmerizing performing quality, Balinese dance possesses a special radiance that originates from a deep cultural regard for the relationship between the spirit and corporeal worlds. The Balinese perceive the dancing body as the consummate physical expression for mystical forces, feelings and imagination. BALAM acknowledges and embraces this viewpoint in its working process and performances. This perspective adds a subtle and profound resonance for both the performer and audience.
