Indonesia is a place for an experience (kantor immigrasi/corrupsi)

Why does everything always come with an egg on top?

Riding buses in the middle of the night (it's dark, can't see anything)

Indonesia (Hello Mister, minta uang! Are we there yet?)

interlude Sundanese kecapi-suling

Dinner in a place with a menu we can read

There is muzak, which in Yogya is mostly Sundanese or Balinese

It's easy listening from islands and cultures far away

but it doesn't sound at all like the performance we saw yesterday

Street musicians come along and the muzak stops so they

can torment us with a set of songs written in LA.

We can here to examine exotic local art

interlude central Javanese gamelan

Got up in the morning and got back on the bus

This is Prambanan, like Teotihuacan (we went there last year) ancient temples, take a picture)

We left Prambanan and got back on the bus

This is Tanah Lot, today is really hot, ancient temples, take a picture, buy a t-shirt

We left Tanah Lot and got back on the bus

This is Dieng Plateau, its on a volcano. ancient temples, steaming sulfur vents, take a picture

What can we bring home with us as souvenirs and gifts?

We left Dieng Plateau and got back on the bus (Let's go shopping!)

A giant carnival, each vendor has a stall

with a PA turned up real loud playing different music

Bad place for souvenirs, gonna hurt our ears if we stay here

Why is it that the natives seek out noisy crowded places filled with rock and roll that I would make a point to stay away from?

We left the exhibition and got back on the bus

I'd like a souvenir (a memento) to remind me I was here (take a picture)

To remind me of the greatness of a time that's past. (hello mister, Malioboro only 500)

The past is being overrun by things imported from the west

So now the people change old to sell it and buy the new

The past is a museum that's increasingly defined by the tourist

Lechad dodi likarat kala p'ney Shabat nekabela

kaku dan berdarah

sujud kau terima

Welcome her with songs of praise, the Sabbath bride, queen of our days.

The text and melody are from a Hebrew song, sung as part of the Friday night Sabbath service.

The meaning is that we should view the arrival of the Sabbath as we do a bride on her wedding day—
we are awe-struck by her beauty and the significance of the ceremony, and we welcome each Sabbath
in this same spirit—as if we are experiencing it for the first time.
