Balaganjur Parade

David Simons, Lisa Karrer

Inspired by traditional Balinese processional music. First heard in an arrangement by Simons, followed by an original Balaganjur by Karrer from her multimedia piece "Woman's Song: The Story of Roro Mendut" (2003).

Mostly Slendro Passacaglia

Barbara Benary

Written in 1994 as an entr'acte for the shadow puppet opera Karna, the piece is built on a five note repeating bass line (gongs), with melodies by clarinet and suling (flute) overlapping it in irregular phrases after the fashion of Purcell and John Blow.

Bubaran Robert

Lou Harrison

From Harrison's seminal **Music For Kyai Hudan Mas**, a traditional Javanese form, adapted by Lou Harrison, for gamelan presented with modified clarinet.

Woman's Song

Lisa Karrer

Also from "Woman's Song: The Story of Roro Mendut" featuring the knobbed gongs called bonang. Text by Sitor Situmorang. Vocalist: Lisa Karrer

Welcome Slendro Clarinet

Daniel Goode

A pied piper piece in which the clarinet draws patterns from a descending slendro scale which the gamelan then picks up, repeating the pattern like a peal of bells.

Abweja

Skip LaPlante

The name, like the music, is a composite of world music sources: **Abwe** for Zimbabwe, whose marimba instgruments are here represented by homemade cardboard tubes, and **Ja** for Java, home of gamelan insgtruments.
