The name, like the music, is a composite of world music sources: **Abwe** for Zimbabwe, whose marimba instruments are here represented by homemade cardboard tubes, and **Ja** for Java, home of gamelan instruments.

Tuned rattles called *angklung* combine and contrast seven rhythmic modes of Arabic music

Angklung pieces: Janger Gegedrongan, Ginuman

Two pieces from the repertoire of the four-note Balinese instruments named for the tuned bamboo rattles which sometimes accompany them.

Javanese composer Sjukur uses a vocal technique combining the sounds of the drums, gongs, and chanting to create a spoken gamelan

Circular breathing is used to emphasize sub-melodies in a circular scale, played on a custom made PVC clarinet to match the gamelan's slendro tuning.


Balinese ceremonial music to release the souls of the dead.
