An excerpt from the score of "Woman's Song: The Story of Roro Mendut,"
Lisa's multi-arts wayang opera which premiered at The Kitchen, NYC 2003. Woman's Song is based on a traditional form called Barang Miring, where the ensemble plays in slendro and the soloist slips between pelog and slendro tunings. The poem, in Batak language, is by Sumatran poet Sitor Situmorang

The Unraveling (2001)

David Simons

... reverses the activity from upper instruments to lower - the gongs are a "walking bass line" instead of their usual cycles. the bonang, played like a Balinese riong, is in pelog scale while all the other instruments are slendro. A musical thread is followed like a ball of string unraveling. Interesting that 'to unravel' means both "fall apart" and "figure out." Recorded by Gamelan Son of Lion on Simons' Tzadik CD Prismatic Hearing.

Cloudrest (premier)

...brings the shakuhachi's use of space, silence and breath into the cyclic rhythms and glorious clamor of the gamelan, with Lisa Karrer's soprano both an extension of the shakuhachi's sound and a link to the gamelan's sound world.

Claudius Smith (2009)

GAMELAN SON OF LION www.gamelansonoflion.org is a new music repertory ensemble and composers' collective based in downtown New York City, specializing in contemporary pieces written for the instruments of the Javanese gamelan percussion orchestra. Founded in 1976 by a trio of composers, the ensemble has been concertizing regularly in the greater New York area and internationally. Its special mission is the development of new repertoire in a variety of contemporary styles using gamelan instruments along with any other world instruments, western or not, chosen by the individual composers, of which more than fifty have contributed to the ensemble's repertoire. The ensemble also collaborates with dance, electronic compositions, shadow puppetry, video and multimedia.

Our instruments were built by co-founder Barbara Benary in Indonesian village style using steel keys, cans, hubcaps, etc. along with traditional drums and gongs, and are tuned in the traditional Javanese slendro and pelog scales.



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
